Overall, just a real big thanks to everyone and I hope to see you all again next year.

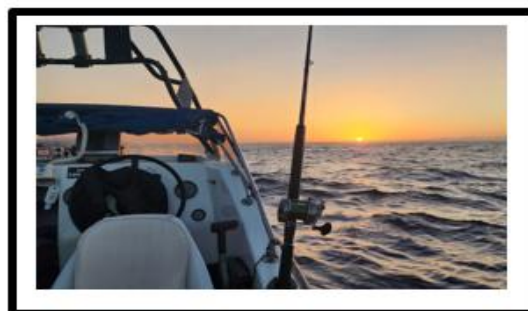
And last of all I would like to finish with the words from a song that started off our day on Up”N”Off.

"Well ... one, I suppose."

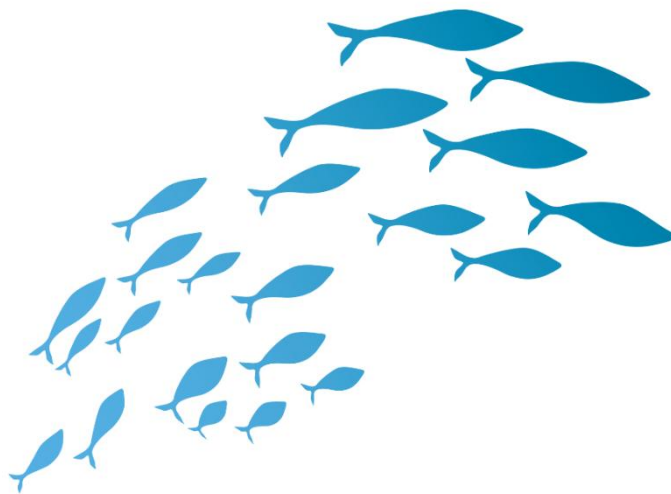
"And how many Fs are there in coffee?"

The Tangimoana Boat Ramp has been constructed and maintained by local volunteers for many years, using mainly donated materials. It has been located at various sites near the Rangitikei River mouth.

The Ramp is OWNED BY NOBODY. It is situated on Iwi land with permission, on the condition that it remains free access for all. It is the only coastal boat ramp in the Manawatu District.

After cyclone Gabrielle, it became apparent that a fundraising organisation was needed for the Ramp. Since there was NO OWNER it meant that flood recovery funds could not be provided. The creation of the Ramp Charity ensures that any donated funds or grants would be protected, and only used for the intended purpose.

100% of all donations/grants received will be spent on construction/maintenance of the Ramp, and the gravel road leading to it off Tangimoana Beach Road.

Bar crossing procedure.

- Call up channel 61 (Tangi Boat radio)
- Say you are approaching the bar.
- Say how many persons on board

After crossing the bar

- Radio, saying you have safely crossed the bar.
- Provide the time you are returning and your direction e.g., towers.
- If you move to another area, please update us.

On return

- Call up channel 61 (Tangi Boat radio)
- Say you are approaching the bar.
- Say how many persons on board.
- Once inside the river, say you are safely across the bar.

If you **travel north** and are having trouble connecting with channel 61, try Whanganui Coastguard channel 64 indicating you launched from Tangimoana.

- Let them know where you are (Turakina or further north)
- Tell Whanganui Coastguard when you are leaving their area.
- Return to Tangi Boat radio channel 61 once you are back in range.

If there is no VHF operating out of Tangimoana you can log on to VHF 60 (Manawatu Marine Boating club) – call sign Foxton sports radio, who have a register of our boats.

Remember all persons on board MUST wear a lifejacket at ALL TIMES.

Put your Call Sign on your boat trailer. That way, if you are late returning to shore, others can contact you on your VHF radio and/or find your contact details where your call sign is



stored. Your details are only used for search and rescue purposes.
