Ladies Bar Busters Competition Rules 2025

1. Competition is an open comp to ALL LADY ANGLERS 16 years and over. The Skipper and boat must be a member of the Tangimoana Boating Club Inc.
 2. Registration is \$25.00 per individual angler. Entry is non-refundable and not transferable after 8pm Friday 7th February 2025. Last entries will be accepted 8pm Friday 7th February.
 3. All people on the boat must be written on official entry form, however ONLY FEMALES are eligible to fish. If found to be in breach of this all entrants on boat may be disqualified. Anglers can be transferred to another boat so long as the radio operators and weighmaster are notified prior to fishing each day.
 4. All skippers are directly responsible for the safety of their crew while at sea, it is the skipper's responsibility to ensure all lady anglers on the boat are registered.
 5. All boats must report via VHF Radio CH 61 on ANY crossing of the bar. Cell phones are not recognised as means of communication. All persons aboard must wear life jackets on all bar crossings or face disqualification.
 6. No boats, apart from nominated official boats, are to cross the bar until the competition is called on. Any boats in the competition that cross the bar prior to the competition being called either on or postponed, with the exception of the officials' boats, will be disqualified.
 7. No fish for competition will be weighed without an entry number.
- . Skippers and crew will be disqualified if the following is not adhered to: Life jackets must be worn by skippers and crew on all bar crossings.
 - . Fish size and limits must meet MPI (Ministry of Primary Industries) regulations.
 - . Any other means of fishing other than rods will not be accepted i.e. long line, set nets.
 - . Maximum of two rods per angler, 3 hooks per rig. Ladies must put down and retrieve gear.
 - .
 - . When weighing in fish: The angler must be wearing her registration band.
 - . Each angler may weigh up to 3 of each species. Fish may be gutted at weigh in at the discretion of the weighmaster.
 - . No mutilated fish will be weighed in with the exception when bleeding Kahawai, Tuna & Kingfish.
 - . All water must be removed from the fish bin prior to entering the weigh station.
 - . Before signing weigh sheet, ensure correct weights have been recorded.
 - . All fish remain the property of the angler and must be removed immediately after weigh in.
 - .
 - . For preservation purposes no sharks will be weighed during the competition.
 - . In the event of equal weight fish, prizes will be awarded in order of the time fish were weighed.
 - . The judges' decision is FINAL.
 - . The Club reserves the right to call the competition off if there is any concern regarding safety to the competitors.
 - . Any person caught breaking any of the above rules will be instantly disqualified and will be brought before the committee, where further penalties may occur.
 - . If the competition is cancelled or all prizes are not caught, Prizes will be drawn highest dollar values first.
 - . Each angler is eligible for one drawn prize unless there are more drawn prizes than anglers.
 - . To be eligible for drawn or spot prizes, angler must be at club rooms & registration tags MUST be worn on angler's wrist.
 - .

Indemnity: The Club accepts no responsibility for any injury or loss of life or loss or damage to boats or equipment. All entrants enter the tournament at their own risk.

Skippers Information

- Officials will be looking at the sea at approximately Saturday 5.15am Report on what it looks like & possible decision will be broadcasted approximately 5.30am. The decision on the competition may be delayed dependant on bar/ sea conditions at that time.
-
- Competition times Saturday are 5:30 am to 11.00 am. If competition called on, no-one but officials are to cross the bar prior to 5:30am.
- Must be in line by 12:00pm, Saturday or 12.30pm Sunday if postponed. Leniency maybe considered due to safety or rescues, please advise Radio Operator if this is the case or for assistance.
- Prizegiving If fished Saturday, prize giving will be 5:30pm Saturday night.
- If postponed Saturday, Prize Giving will be Sunday 5.30pm regardless of whether fished Sunday or cancelled. If cancelled Prizes will be drawn, Angler must be at club for drawn prizes.

- Spot Prizes – Saturday 6pm Spot Prizes will be drawn Saturday night at 6pm even if postponed Saturday. Angler must be at club at time of spot prizes being drawn.
-

If postponed Saturday, time of viewing sea on Sunday will be advised and competition times, weigh in etc may be changed accordingly. Prize Giving will still be 6pm.

BBQ Donation of Fish – Any donation of fish for whichever day fished would be appreciated. Food will be simple, Fish, sausages, onions, bread.

Surfcasting Competition Rules – 22 Feb 2025

- Fishing Time:** 6:00 am to 4:00 pm
- Final Weigh in:** Rods out by 4.00pm
- Weighing Fish:** Fish to be weighed at the boating club when the club is open from 4pm
- Prize giving:** 7 pm (approx.) at Tangimoana Boating Club rooms.

- Rules:**
1. Entries are non-transferable or refundable.
 2. Fishing is within the flagged areas only, Max 2 rods or hand lines, max 3 hooks per rod. Any casting other than by hand is strictly forbidden and will face disqualification.
 3. All anglers entered must display official registration tags – 1 on rod & 1 on wrist - or may be disqualified. No registration tag – no weigh in.
 4. In the event of fish of equal weight, prize will be awarded in time order of fish weighed.
 5. Any angler not adhering to the above rules or MPI regulations will be instantly disqualified.
 6. Entrants must be present at prize giving to be eligible for spot or drawn prizes and must present their wrist bands.
 7. For any fishing disputes, the committee decision is final. Tangimoana Boating club reserves the right to alter any rules or decisions due to anything unforeseeable,

Weighing of fish: All fin fish

Stingrays and Sharks are not eligible.

Notes: If you light a fire on the beach it **must be** well away from the sand dunes, and you **must extinguish** it completely before leaving the beach. **Vehicles entering the beach is at own risk.**

The Tangimoana Boat Ramp has been constructed and maintained by local volunteers for many years, using mainly donated materials. It has been located at various sites near the Rangitikei River mouth.

The Ramp is OWNED BY NOBODY. It is situated on Iwi land with permission, on the condition that it remains free access for all. It is the only coastal boat ramp in the Manawatu District.

After cyclone Gabrielle, it became apparent that a fundraising organisation was needed for the Ramp. Since there was NO OWNER it meant that flood recovery funds could not be provided. The creation of the Ramp Charity ensures that any donated funds or grants would be protected, and only used for the intended purpose.

100% of all donations/grants received will be spent on construction/maintenance of the Ramp, and the gravel road leading to it off Tangimoana Beach Road.

SAFETY INFORMATION- Johnny Brown + Jason Brown+ Ali Brown – Safety and Rescue Liaison

Bar crossing procedure.

- Call up channel 61 (Tangi Boat radio)
- Say you are approaching the bar.
- Say how many persons on board

After crossing the bar

- Radio, saying you have safely crossed the bar.
- Provide the time you are returning and your direction e.g., towers.
- If you move to another area, please update us.

On return

- Call up channel 61 (Tangi Boat radio)
- Say you are approaching the bar.
- Say how many persons on board.
- Once inside the river, say you are safely across the bar.

If you **travel north** and are having trouble connecting with channel 61, try Whanganui Coastguard channel 64 indicating you launched from Tangimoana.

- Let them know where you are (Turakina or further north)
- Tell Whanganui Coastguard when you are leaving their area.
- Return to Tangi Boat radio channel 61 once you are back in range.

If there is no VHF operating out of Tangimoana you can log on to VHF 60 (Manawatu Marine Boating club) – call sign Foxton sports radio, who have a register of our boats.

Remember all persons on board MUST wear a lifejacket at ALL TIMES.

Put your Call Sign on your boat trailer. That way, if you are late returning to shore, others can contact you on your VHF radio and/or find your contact details where your call sign is stored. Your details are only used for search and rescue

purposes.
